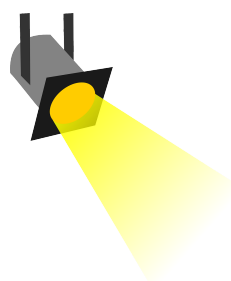

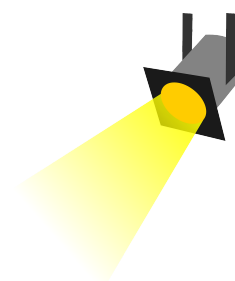
### The Community Spotlight:

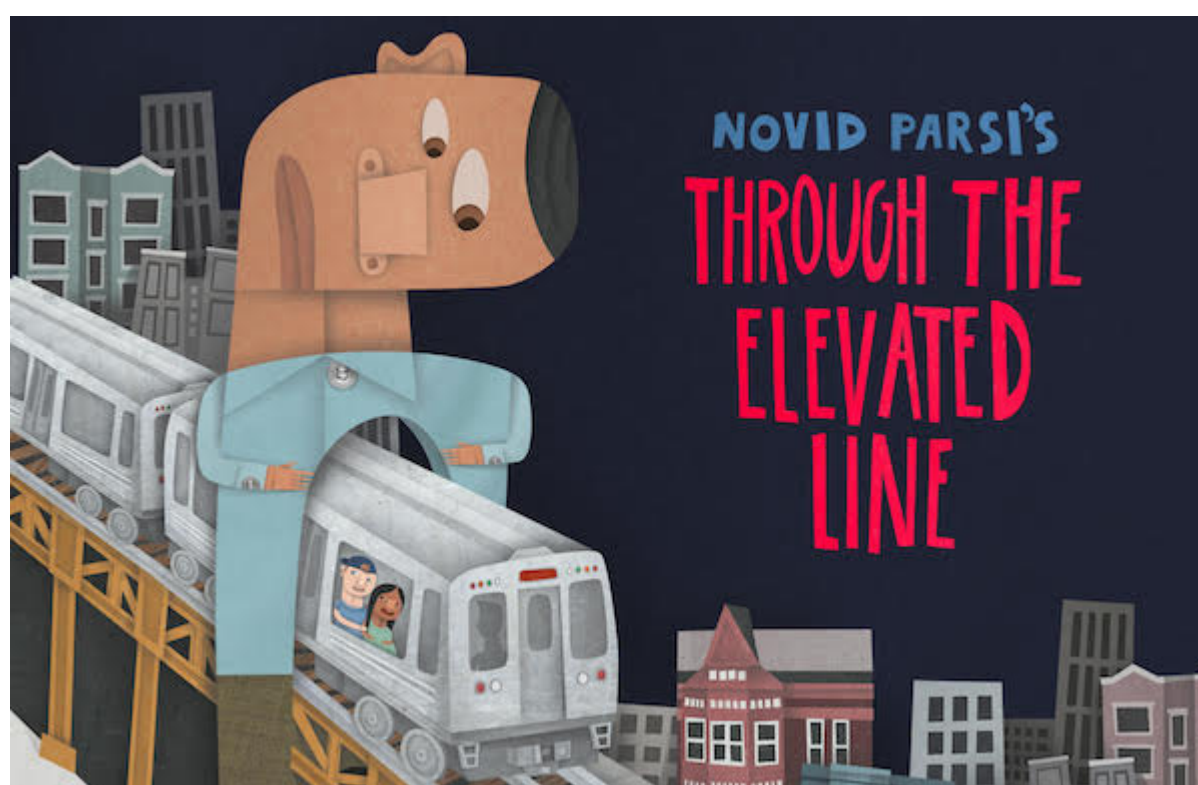

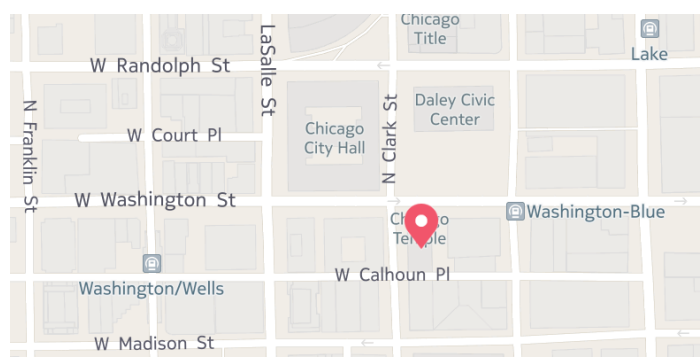
