Meet Hidaya and Naballah. They are hijabistas. Hijabista is a combination of the words "hijab" and "fashionista."

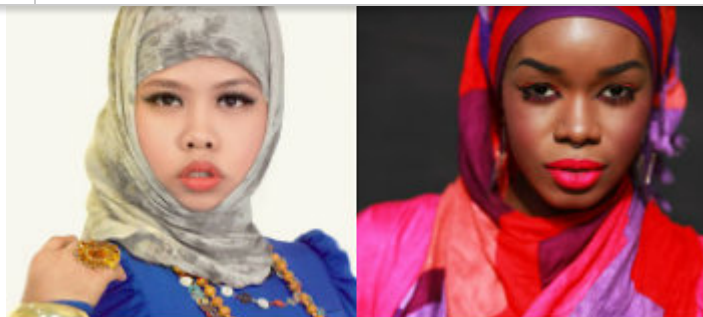
